## **Liberals maintain lead over Conservatives**

### **On track for thin minority**

TORONTO, NOVEMBER 14<sup>th</sup>, 2013 - In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 1834 Canadian voters, close to 4-in-10 will vote Liberal if a federal election were held today (38%), compared to about 3-in-10 who will vote Conservative (29%), and these findings are essentially stable since last month (October 23 - 40% and 28%, respectively). The NDP will take less than a quarter of the vote (22%, steady from 20% last month), while the Greens and the Bloc Quebecois will take about a twentieth of the vote each (4% and 6%, respectively). Very few will vote for other parties (1%). Liberal support is especially common to those in mid-age groups (45 to 54 - 43%), Atlantic Canada (49%), the best educated (post grad - 46%), non-Europeans (49%) and those with children in the household (42%). Of note, one quarter of those who voted NDP in the last election will vote Liberal this time (26%), as will one eighth of past Conservative voters (16%). Few past Liberal voters will opt this time for the Conservatives (4%) or the NDP (10%).

### **Liberals to capture thin minority**

If these results were projected to seats in a 308 seat House of Commons, the Liberals would capture 134, 21 short of a majority, and down from 146 last month (but well up from 34 at the election). The Conservatives would take 108 seats, stable from 104 last month (but well down from their 166 seat majority at the election). The NDP would take 53 seats, up from 47 last month, and the Bloc Quebecois would take 12, stable from 10 in October. Green Party leader Elizabeth May would keep her single seat.

### **Harper, Trudeau favourables down slightly**

Prime Minister Stephen Harper has the approval of 3-in-10 Canadian voters (31%), down slightly from last month (34%), but his disapproval is 61%, for a truly abysmal net favourable (approve minus disapprove) of -30. Justin Trudeau has the approval of less than a half (46%), down slightly since last month (49%), and his net is a positive +9. Thomas Mulcair's approval has stayed stable across the month (41%), and his net is +10.

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## Trudeau seen to make best Prime Minister

Justin Trudeau is seen by the plurality to make the best Prime Minister of the four federalist leaders (27%), closely followed by Stephen Harper (25%), and these results have narrowed the gap slightly since last month (31% and 25%, respectively). Thomas Mulcair has seen his adherents stay stable since last month (15% then, 17% now).

"The last time we polled, Mike Duffy had just finished testifying in the senate. The Conservatives' numbers suffered then, and they haven't recovered, so it doesn't appear the Party Convention or the Rob Ford distractions are helping them as much as they thought," said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

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## **Methodology**

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1834 randomly selected Canadians 18 years of age and older. The poll was conducted on November 12-13<sup>th</sup>, 2013.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 2%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at [www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp](http://www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp)

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
