Increased majority agree students in Ontario Catholic schools should be allowed to form GSAs

Majority also want them called GSAs

Toronto, June 5th, 2012 - In a sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ among Ontarians 18 years of age and older, the majority want students at publicly funded Catholic schools to be able to form GSAs (55%), and the majority also wants students to be able to call them GSAs by name (53%). This represents an increase since last month in those who want students to be allowed to form GSAs (from 51%). One half of those educated in Ontario's Catholic school system agree students should be able to form these clubs (53%) and call them GSAs (50%).

Younger participants and those without a political preference for the provincial Conservatives were more likely to back GSAs and calling them that in Ontario Catholic schools.

One half wants public funding of Catholic schools to end

One half of those polled said they disagreed with Catholic schools receiving public funding in Ontario (48%), while just more than 4-in-10 said they wanted funding to continue (43%). This is similar to the one half of respondents who disagreed with public funding in January 2012, when we first asked this question (49%). Catholics and those who attended the Catholic school system strongly support continued funding (74% and 68%, respectively).

Eastern Ontarians were more likely to agree with Catholic schools receiving public funding than other participants of other regions (55%; compared to 47% N Ontario, 42% SW Ontario, 40% Toronto – 905, 39% Toronto – GTA, and 38% Toronto – 416).

Wide majority disagree with church's stated position on homosexuality

Two thirds of those polled said they disagreed with the Catholic church's position that homosexuality is "intrinsically disordered" (61%) including the majority of those raised as Catholics (56%) and those educated in the Ontario Catholic school system (61%).

Middle-aged participants (20% 18-34, 27% 35-44, 32% 45-54, 22% 55-64, 26% 65+) and provincial Conservative supporters (36%; compared to 19% Green, 18% Liberal, and 18% NDP) were more likely to agree with the church's position.

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Most disagree with 1982 decision extending Catholic schools funding

Close to one half (45%) say, in retrospect, they disagree with the decision to extend Catholic school funding from primary schools to secondary schools. Catholics and those who attended Catholic schools are most likely to say they agree with this decision (66% and 59%, respectively).

Most want funding to end; some want primary and secondary funded, few want primary funded only

More than 4-in-10 (42%) say, when presented with a range of Catholic school funding options, that public funding should end, while just more than a third (35%) think funding should continue as at present. Few opt for funding primary Catholic schools only (13%). About half or more Catholics and those educated in that school system say they want full funding to continue (56% and 50%, respectively).

Older participants (14% 18-34, 12% 35-44, 14% 45-54, 9% 55-64, 16% 65+) and backers of the provincial Liberals (16%; compared to 15% Conservatives, 12% NDP, and 9% Green) were more likely to side with the option of funding Catholic primary schools only.

Majority agree with public sector pay freeze

More than half of Ontarians (54%) agree that the entire public sector should be required to accept a two-year pay freeze, compared to about a third who disagree (28%), and just under a fifth who have not formed an opinion on the matter (18%). This is comparable to the proportion who supported this kind of pay freeze in January, 2012 (56%).

Few agree nurses overpaid in Ontario; some think GPs and specialists are

Just 1-in-7 Ontarians agrees nurses are overpaid in this province (16%), while about one quarter think GPs are overpaid (28%) and one third think specialists, like radiologists and ophthalmologists are overpaid (34%).

Younger Ontarians (37% 18-34, 28% 35-44, 28% 45-54, 24% 55-64, 18% 65+) were more likely to agree that family doctors and GPs are overpaid in our province. Half of provincial Conservative supporters (53%) felt that medical specialists are not overpaid, but this group was most likely to agree that nurses are overpaid, following Green supporters (25% Green, 20% Conservative, 13% NDP, and 10% Liberal).

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PCs lead NDP by 6 points

If an election were held today, more than a third would support the PCs (36%), compared to 1-in-3 who would support the NDP (30%). The Liberals would claim the support of just fewer than this (28%), while the Green Party could claim the support of fewer than one twentieth (4%).

Males (40%; compared to 32% of females) and Ontarians residing in Eastern Ontario and the Toronto – 905 regions (49%, 41%; compared to 36% SW Ontario, 34% Toronto – GTA, 29% N Ontario, and 24% Toronto – 416) were more likely to support the provincial Conservatives.

Conservatives to form minority government; NDP cheated out of seats

Taking into account margin for error, these voting intention results — if they hold on Election Day — would see the PCs take 52 seats out of the 107 seat legislature, with 37 going to the Liberals and just 18 to the NDP. The relatively poor performance of the NDP in seat count in relation to their share of the popular vote is due to the inefficiency of the distribution of their support, in that it is widespread, but not concentrated in many winnable ridings. These projections are subject to applicable margins of error.

Hudak's favourables up; still lowest of three leaders

Dalton McGuinty's favourables have not shifted since last month (27% approval), and those for Andrea Horwath have shifted slightly down from last month's high of 50% (to 47% this month). Tim Hudak, however, has improved his approval rating from 20% to 24% since last month. In terms of net approval (approve minus disapprove), Andrea Horwath leads firmly at +21, followed by Tim Hudak at -26 and Dalton McGuinty at -35.

Residents of the Toronto – 416 region were more likely to approve of McGuinty (43%; compared to 33% Toronto – GTA, 27% Toronto – 905, 24% E Ontario, 22% SW Ontario, and 15% N Ontario).

More than one third want a provincial election

More than one third of those polled said an election was needed in Ontario (38%), and this is similar to the level noted last month (36%). Naturally, PC supporters (54%) and NDP supporters (43%) are more eager to see an election than Liberals (12%).

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Liberals are at disadvantage for voter enthusiasm

Half the supporters of both the PCs and the NDP said they were "very enthusiastic" about voting for their parties (52% each), compared to just more than one third of Liberal supporters (37% very enthusiastic).

One half want Deb Matthews to resign over ORNGE

One half those polled said Health Minister Deb Matthews should resign over the ORNGE affair (48%), and this represents a significant increase over the 4-in-10 (41%) who wanted a resignation in March of this year when the scandal first made news.

Supporters of the provincial Conservatives (63%; compared to 53% Green, 49% NDP, and 29% Liberal) were more likely to agree that Matthews should resign.

Federal Conservatives lead Ontarians' voter preference

If a federal election were held tomorrow, more than one third of Ontarians would vote Conservative (36%), compared to 3-in-10 who would vote for the NDP (31%). Just one quarter would support the federal Liberals (25%).

Almost half of Eastern Ontarians support the federal Conservatives (45%).

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Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1038 randomly selected residents of Ontario aged 18 or older. The poll was conducted on June 4th, 2012.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3.04%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp.

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.

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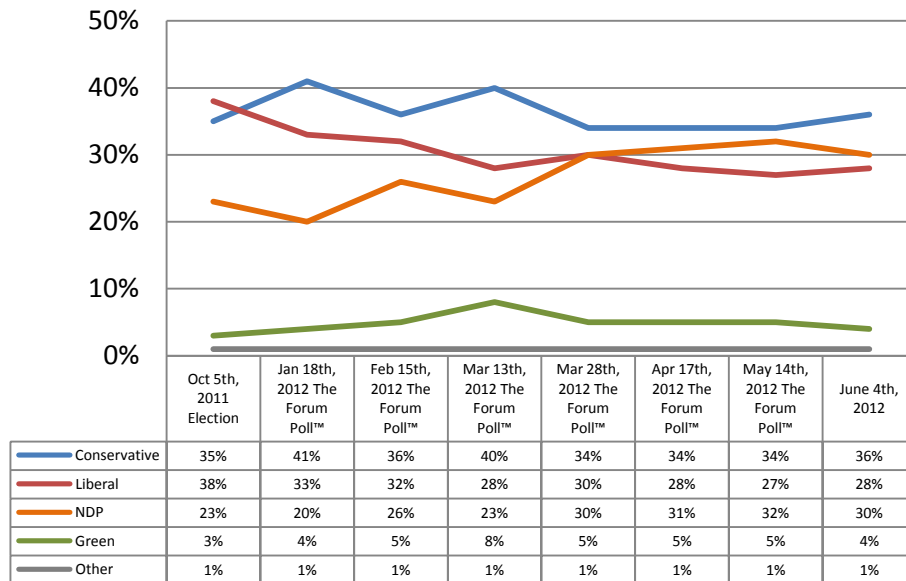


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Provincial Party Preference Trending [Decided / Leaning]

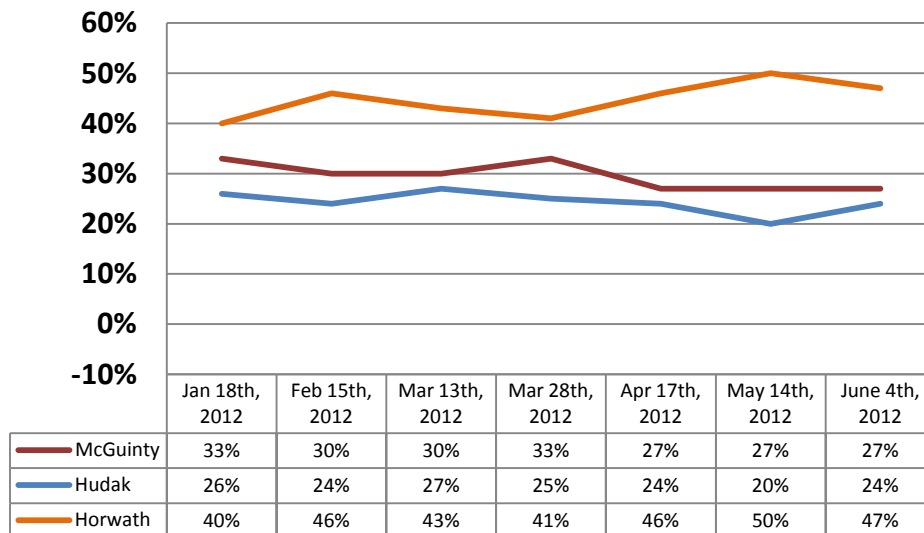
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Ontario Provincial Party Leader Approval Rating Trending (% Approve)

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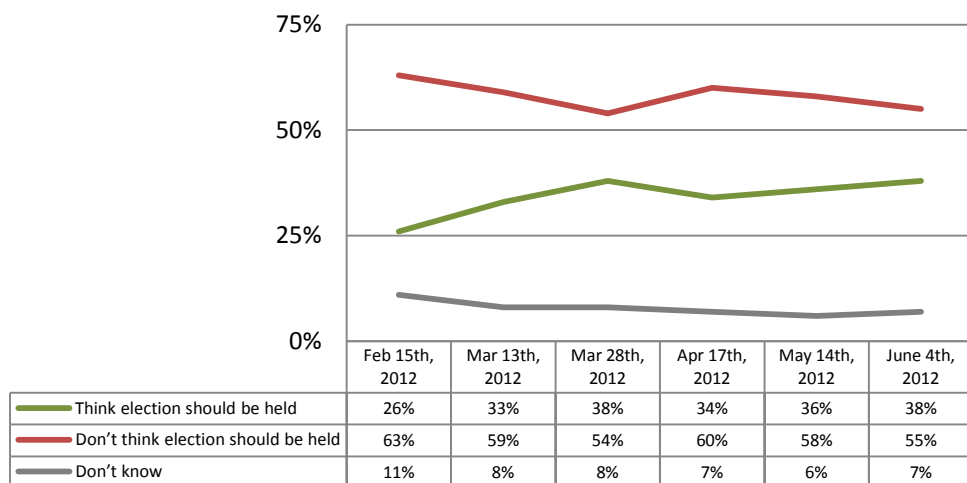
