Liberals, Conservatives tied in Burlington North-Oakville

Justin Trudeau with highest favourables

TORONTO MAY 13th, 2014 - In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 530 voters in the new federal riding of Burlington North-Oakville, where there has been controversy over MP Eve Adams' attempt to become the next Conservative nominee, the Liberals (45%) and Conservatives (42%) are basically tied in their voting preferences if the election were held today. In this situation, the NDP does not compete(8%), nor do the Greens (3%) or any other party (2%). Of note, one fifth of past Conservative voters will vote Liberal this time around (19%).

Trudeau has highest favourables

Close to one half of voters in the riding approve of Justin Trudeau (47%), but opinion is polarized, and his net favourable (approve minus disapprove) is +8. Four-in-ten approve of the Prime Minister (39%), but his net is a troubling -13. Tom Mulcair draws approval from a similar proportion (37%), but his net is a positive +4.

Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 530 randomly selected Burlington North-Oakville residents 18 years of age and older. The poll was conducted on May 12th, 2014.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 4%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Actual results will depend on the parties' success at getting their voters out. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
