

# The winds of political change could blow through the Region

A new public opinion poll - called one of the largest of its kind in Canada - suggests Ontarians could be in for a minority government when the dust settles on October 6th.

The Forum Research survey says the Liberals and Conservatives are neck and neck heading into the stretch run of the campaign.

The Toronto Star reports the survey of over 40,000 people also suggests we could be in for some changes in Waterloo Region.

It finds the Conservative candidates in Kitchener Centre and Kitchener-Conestoga are leading Liberal incumbents John Milloy and Leeanna Pendergast, and the Liberal challenger in Kitchener-Waterloo is leading Conservative incumbent Elizabeth Witmer.

In Cambridge, where there is no incumbent, the poll says Conservative candidate Rob Leone is leading.
